
Its time to show these rwd guys how to drive!

Not so long ago we had no going car with Kingsley slowly building his new 2WD project. Then a "tractor" caught his eye with all the fruit he wanted, and with a bit of convincing that we really NEEDED 2 rally cars we were the proud new owners of an Evo 8.

The first excursion at the Ponganui Rd rally sprint ended better than expected, taking 1st overall, with Kingsley settling into the new car and his first experience with a dog box.

One more event was needed as a shakedown before taking the new toy north for our favourite event- Rally of the North. We tossed up between Wairarapa and Rally NZ, and dollar wise they came out pretty equal so we opted to stay close to home and do the Possum Bourne Memorialwhich was my first time over the "international" roads.

Friday overnight it absolutely pissed down so I was a bit nervous about the road condition, and sitting 32nd on the road it had the potential to really churn up- especially on the 2nd pass. Also our lack of budget meant we only had limited 2nd hand rubber for the day.

The 1st stage was slippery with lots of clay but was in good conditionalthough the first 6km were pretty hairy on cold tyres and trying to settle into the rhythm. About 1/2 way through Kingsley absolutely nailed a long 2R uphill, and really got his confidence back- only to come around a corner to flooding! Nothing so disconcerting as seeing a lake where the road should be, it kept us pretty wary for the rest of the stage.

SS2 was fine apart from a bit of brake fade towards the end, but it was the short third stage (New Franklin) that we finally started having fun; Kingsley 'almost knew it' from years of watching WRC, it had heaps of crests to make life interesting and keep me on my toes with the notes, and we were also looking out for the spot Patrick rolled it as we'd driven

WHARITI HILL CLIMB

12th and 13th March 2011

Why do I do it. - One of the greatest hill climbs in New Zealand up there with the mini pikes peak in Wanganui. Better than Race to the sky - more runs and tighter.

The Whariti peak hill climb is just through the Manawatu gorge from Palmerston North. Near Woodville. It's a very steep hillclimb which runs from the base of the peak to the top and slightly down the other side, right near the wind turbines. Its 8k in length, with about 90 corners and one big fast section, very hard pack'd road. The road starts out fast and open, 6th gear up and over the brow just after the start. Then the corners start, those ones that come back on themselves, fantastic banking so you can really push it through the corners. Dancing from one corner to the next. A couple you can really back the car in (yes even in a FWD). About 15 corners later it opens up again along a valley with a bit of downhill, time for a breather and up into 5th. Now back into 2nd for the climb, corner to corner with no straights 2nd 3rd 2nd 3rd 2nd 3rd and so on for about 50 corners, its so steep all you see in front of you is the road, This carries on for about 4 mins then you reach the top as you get airborne over the brow and hard on the brakes before the cautioned drop off! . Then a very tight but fast moderate downhill along the ridge line to the finish. Couple of off camber corners with drops, so got to really have your wits about you for the last 2 k. All over in under 7 mins. You know you have just driven the hardest hill climb in the country, you are sweating like a pig and your arms are falling off. The tour down really shows you how steep some of the road is - OMG!.

Last year I was fastest 2WD, its a tyre shredder, so this year I took bigger harder tyres, but the car destroyed the 205's in 1.5 runs ..just got them too hot.

past him while out spectating last year.

Then back to Hamptons where we had a designated tyre change area and our crew did us proud changing all 4 with time to spare in the allotted 5min, then to SS4 which was 2 laps around the track- wet tarmac on cold gravel tyres- Kingsley loved it- I was packing myself! It's amazing how quick and close everything looks without your head buried in the pacenotes.

After lunch it was back to Te Akau for the 2nd run through, this time at least there was a bulletin warning of the water, but we were keeping it conservative- Alex Kelsey had run out of gas on the Hamptons stage, and with Shannon Chambers' turbo expiring we came out of SS5 leading Possum.

The next 2 stages we kept things toned down to make it across the finish line- which I know Kingsley hates to do- but this was still just a shakedown to familiarize him with the new car- not a balls out for glory event.

Back at Hamptons and Kingsley again had fun around the track while I had images of us rolling end over end or wrapped around a bollard and ending the day with an expensive new lump of scrap metal. We did however make it to the end without incident and at prize giving that night found we'd taken the Possum Bourne Memorial trophy with a very respectable 3min 42sec lead.

We'd entered the second day for some more seat time, and especially to do the iconic Whaanga Coast, but that wasn't to be- 2km into the first stage of the day we pulled the thread out of the rear dif mount?!? We cruised out of the stage and Kingsley fixed it roadside- but it pulled again touring to the remote refuel so we ducked into service 1 stage early after the refuel to try a more permanent fix, but it pulled out again 6km into the next stage. The decision was made to retire, rather than risk damage, and we went and spectated Whaanga instead.




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The End is Nigh-Yeah Right
